- Participate in a 3 days training session provide by the core research team.
- Conduct phone surveys following provided protocols, guidelines, and standardized questionnaires.
- Ensure the accuracy and completeness of data collected during survey interactions.
- Maintaining professionalism, empathy, and sensitivity during survey interactions to ensure participants feel comfortable and respected.
- Address participant queries or concerns with tact and diplomacy, adhering to ethical standards and confidentiality requirements.
- Document survey responses accurately and comprehensively.



- Ensure safeguarding of participants throughout data collection process, also maintain confidentiality and adherence to data protection protocols.
- Conducting health-related data collection, including surveys and assessments, using tablets as per requirements and taking notes.
- Meet designated targets for completed surveys within specified timelines.
- Provide regular progress updates to the supervisor, reporting any challenges or deviations from established protocols.
- Immediately communicate with the research team in times of confusion or any difficulties during the process of data collection.
- Should follow the norms and rules of HERD International during the contract period.
- Should strongly follow research ethics as outlined in the 'National Ethical Guidelines for Health Research in Nepal' developed by the Nepal Health Research Council (NHRC) while collecting data.
